SUPER COMPACT SPORTCYCLE YAMAHA 125 STREET AS3

Sportcycles, big or small, are progressively expanding their markets around the world.

The 125cc class at large is most suitable for those who want to enjoy effortless handling and exciting performance culiar to this class.

Yamaha has recently marketed its latest 125cc sport version under the designation of Yamaha 125 Street AS3 to serve the abovementioned purpose more efficiently than ever.

The AS3 has been straight developed from Yamaha's world-beating production racers, 250cc TD2B and 350cc TR2B, so have been its bigger brothers, 250cc DS7 and 350cc R5. Just take a glance at it, and you will find it overall enlarged in size, as compared with its predecessors. It has been also improved in outlooking with more refined components and color finish, which must be one of the largest selling points for you.

Twin Aluminum Cylinder

The AS3 features Yamaha's renowned twincarb. twin-aluminum cylinder engine. Both starters operate in linkage to assure steady starting even in the coldest season. An air cleaner has been improved in shape for higher breathing efficiency.


5-port cylinders are made of light aluminum alloy to increase cooling efficiency to a maximum together with well-designed head fins. Yamaha's renowned Autolube keeps an engine ideally lubricated at any time.

A close ratio 5-speed gearbox incorporates a linkage mechanism for shifting just like Yamaha road racers. These innovations together with a fresh sensed design of crankcase cover add a massive feeling to the powerplant of the AS3.

Refined Components and Extra Safety

As for the body, the design of diamond type pipe frame has followed the example of Yamaha's unbeaten road racers for extra ruggedness. Overall dimensions have been enlarged for improved riding comfort, say, length from 1,859mm to 1,915mm, and wheelbase from 1,200mm to 1,240mm. The saddle is so designed that it can be opened from the side. The Ceriani-type front fork is worthy of heavy duties. Long cushion stroke assures smooth and comfortable riding. A rear cushion is ready to operate at 5 stages just to meet varied riding conditions. Included in standard equipments are a large-size 9-litre fuel tank, and very readable tachometer and speedometer. Another notable feature of the AS3 is top class safety assured by a powerful front 150mm drum brake and side refelectors on front and rear in addition to a large-size stoplamp.

K. Carruthers' Double —71 Daytona 100 Miler—



Australian ace K. Carruthers riding a D. Vesco's 250cc TD2 made it a double with a record-breaking 101.36mph at the '71 Daytona 100 mile race held on March 13.

The toughest challenge came from American ace C. Rayborn riding a Yamaha 250cc TD2, too. They were evenly matched and fought a hectic battle for the first half of the race. Then, Carruthers put on the pressure and pulled ahead just far enough to consolidate his lead from Rayborn. 19-year old D. McDaniels from Michigan finished third with G. Fisher fourth, S. McLaughlin fifth and R. Hempstead sixth, all on Yamahas.


Yamaha Leads Boat Age





Report from West Pakistan

The high performance of Yamaha trail bikes has been repeatedly proved in long-distance tours extending over thousands or tens of thousands miles. Recently a daring young Japanese has organized and set out on a million-mile world-circling tour stretching over a period of four years, riding a 250cc DT1, which enjoys an established reputation in the Yamaha trail class.


His name is Shoji Suzuki. He is a 23-year-old regular fellow and a graduate of Tokyo College of Economics.

In high spirits Mr. Suzuki left Japan in the middle of January, 1971, and reached West Pakistan by sea via Hongkong at the end of January.

Hearty Welcome

He visited Yamaha distributors in major cities such as Karachi, Saddar, and Lahore and received an enthusiastic welcome. Journalism there was very responsive to this grand undertaking and gave large space to the introduction of it.

After staying in West Pakistan for a few days, Mr. Suzuki started for Afghanistan, showing no signs of fatigue and is expected to visit nearly 60 countries from now on. He is to carry through his round-the-world plan while earning the traveling expenses on his tour.



Gasoline

A motorcycle engine is an internal combustion powerplant running on gasoline, whether it is a 2-stroke or 4-stroke type.

Recently, the problem of air-pollution arising from gasoline combustion is becoming a matter of wider concern, though it is mainly concerned with automobiles. It is necessary for you to have a correct knowledge of what gasoline is, first of all, in handling it properly.

Crude Petroleum


In remote ages dead animals and plants under the ground turned into crude petroleum in course of time. When human beings happened to discover it, they used to think highly of it as burning water.

At present crude petroleum is refined into diversified chemical products which are very useful for our daily life.

YAMAHA SERVICE TIP

How to refine crude petroleum into gasoline is shown as below:

Crude petroleum in a tank is distilled by means of heating. Gasoline is taken out next to gas, as it is lighter than any other materials but gas in a tank.



Octane rating specifies the grade of gasoline's anti-knocking property. In a word, the higher octane rating is, the higher this property becomes. Accordingly, octane rating has close relation to an engine's compression ratio.

Regular gasoline on the market is rated 70-90 which is suitable for an engine with 6-8: 1 compression ratio.

High octane gasoline is rated over 90 for an engine with 8:1 or higher compression ratio.

How to Handle

Gasoline is extremely inflammable. It must be stored at a cool and well ventilated place which is free from a danger of fire. In case gasoline catches fire, use fire extinguishers of foam, powder or CO2 types to shut off air. No supply of oxygen means no combustion.
